#### 1. Minutes Accepted

1.1 Minutes of 11.01.05 meeting accepted

#### 2. Outcome of November Faculty Senate Meeting

2.1 Rob Poodiack distributed copies of an Action Paper from the Provost to the President of the Faculty Senate. The President approved a motion for the purchase of an anti-plagiarism software pending CAT coming up with recommendations regarding product choice and specifics for integrating it.

2.2 CAT to check in with Gail Poitras re: various costs, details of required waivers, and suggestions for piloting.

2.3 Jason Keinsley raised the issue of 'privacy' with the software database, particularly with students who are also professionals.

#### 3. Printer Decision

3.1 The Faculty Senate also approved a motion recommending the suspension of the policy of removing personal printers from faculty offices pending factual data supporting the policy.

3.2 CAT is responsible for collecting this data; (contact Dave, Phil, Kathy, Facilities).

#### 4. Printer Usage System

4.1 The issue of printer usage extends beyond the data collection for the faculty printers policy. Currently, 25% of the faculty (those using Macs) cannot print to the new Imagistics printer/copiers. In addition there was limited, under-advertised, and poorly scheduled Imagistics training for the new copier/printers. No one knew about it. What is the overall vision for printer usage? Does each faculty have a limit? Are there cards? As more information goes up on the web, are printer costs being simply moving to the labs? Should students have a limit? Is there any information on current printer usage? Steve Brautigan will check with Joe re: an inventory of printer usages.

#### 5. Wireless Proposal

5.1 James Bressor is to present a campus wide wireless proposal to the Alden Trust. It is not clear how much funding is available. A minimum of \$125,000 is needed. Members of CAT and faculty can e-mail Gail with academic justifications for wireless proposal. How can technology facilitate the learning environment?  
Is there a way to thinking creatively about the campus vs. the classroom as a learning environment?
